FICM Workforce Strategic Stages

From the formation of the Faculty of the Intensive Care Medicine in October 2010, workforce was considered a core part of its future activities. Faculties and Royal Colleges are uniquely placed to provide both professional oversight and direction to discussions in these areas. With a seat at the Academy, the FICM is also able to contribute as part of medicine as a whole.

After managing its immediate foundation activities and then progressed swiftly to the creation of a workforce function, initially through an Advisory Group.

Creation of the new programme								

The FICM managed the birth of the ICM National Recruitment Programme, including working with Regional Advisors and Training Programme Directors to create the first tranche of posts in 2012. By 2017, post numbers had grown by 230%. The huge work of the local RAs and TPDs was supplemented by the FICM with evidence (RA Workforce Data Packs were produced from 2014) and visits to meet with local deaneries. Work is now concentrated on regions which have grown by comparatively smaller numbers than the UK average.

The first doctor certifying under the curriculum and recruitment completed their training in 2016.

Baseline data								

The first baseline data was first created in 2012 as part of a suite of activities that led to the creation of the Centre for Workforce Intelligence's (CfWI) report on their in depth review of the specialty. This has now been regularly added to and improved from 2014 onwards with the annual Medical Workforce Census. Each year the census will be used to gather related workforce information on the specialty with 2018 additionally focussed on wellbeing and with 2019 provisionally focussed on both fatigue and allied professions.

Outputs:

- The FICM engaged closely with the CfWI, throughout their in-depth review of ICM workforce, providing expert advice and data. This led to the production of this <u>report</u>.

Beginning with a position paper in 2015, the FICM progressed from national baseline data to more nuanced data produced directly from engagement with Trusts and Health Boards regionally. Phase 1 was undertaken between the Autumn of 2015 and the Autumn of 2017. Phase 2 will begin in November 2018.

The <u>Critical Futures initiative</u> began its life as a first wave survey to members and other stakeholders in the critical care community. The first report was released in the autumn of 2017, and this has now birthed work streams to take forward its recommendations.

Public & stakeholder engagement								

The wealth of information gathered above has allowed us to take forward national engagement with media and public stakeholders. The FICM has been meeting with the NHS Improvement (Mar 18), the Department of Health and Social Care (May 18), NHS England (May 18), and others to take forward the workforce message.
