Major maxillo-facial reconstructive centre & major general, ENT and gynae-oncology centre. The Critical Care Unit has it's own bronchoscopy stack and scopes, echo machine and ultrasound machines. It is also completely computerised, with a Clinical Information System, including electronic notes, charting and prescribing. We have an active research interest and there is opportunity to develop experience in all of these areas. We have 2 FICE accredited mentors and can provide training in supervision in point of care ultrasound & echo.
