# 3.7 How is the unit staffed?

One 'consultant of the week' Monday-Thursday 0830-1800 with on-call consultant 1700-0830 weekdays and 0830-0830 weekends.

Minimum 2 trainee/ACCPs on unit during day, minimum 1 trainee on overnight. Average 4-5 trainees on during day. Dedicated ICU pharmacist cover Monday-Friday, routine physiotherapy 7 days a week, emergency cover 24h/day.

Part 4 Training

#### 4.1 Details of training opportunities on the unit

Focused echocardiography and chest ultrasound. 2 consultants are FICE supervisors, 3 are FICE mentors and 3 are CUSIC supervisors. Training to FICE/CUSIC accreditation standard is available.

Regional cancer and haematology centre and regional infectious diseases unit.

Quality improvement – this unit was a pilot unit in Scottish Patient Safety Programme.

Opportunities for senior ICM trainees to 'act up' as consultant of the week.

#### 4.2 Details of departmental teaching

Weekly Journal Club

Monthly core trainee teaching

Monthly FFICM preparation course / registrar training days

"5 minute teaching" sessions run every weekday morning after morning handover

#### 4.3 Details of clinical governance meetings days and / or M & M

M&M meetings held every Friday afternoon. Monthly departmental Quality Improvement meetings with opportunities for trainees to get involved in projects.

# 4.4 Number of trainees on each tier of the rota

6 core trainees on junior rota, alongside approx. 4 Advanced Critical Care Practitioners. Variable level of registrar cover – approx. 50% nights will have registrar cover. Registrars can be from anaesthesia, ICM or medical specialties.
