3.6 Details of research projects being undertaken within the unit

Active with SPARC (Southcoast Perioperative Audit & Research Collaboration), previous research projects include REMAP-CAP, RECOVERY, GenOMICC, POETICS2, Transfusion Thresholds, Lung Protective Ventilation etc. Appraising next research opportunities.

3.7 How is the unit staffed?

Currently 7 Consultants, recruiting to 1:8, with one Consultant covering 24/7 Monday-Friday then Friday-Monday, resident 10 hours each weekday, 12 hours over the weekend, on-call from home out of hours.

Weekday daytime junior medical cover: usually 1x FY2 doctor, 1-3x other doctors which may include CT1-2 ACCS/Anaesthetic Trainee, IM Trainee etc.

Out of hours junior medical cover: 2nd on tier – ST3-7 Anaesthetic Trainee/Specialty Doctor, 1st on tier – CT1-2 Anaesthetic Trainee/Trust Grade Doctor with flexible working to cover ICU, Theatres, Obstetrics, Resus and Crash Calls depending on workload and competency.

Nursing staff currently 61, usually 8 per shift plus 1 supervisor (flexible according to acuity). Healthcare assistants 7, 1 per shift.

Daily/regular multi-disciplinary input including Physiotherapists, Pharmacists, Microbiologists, SALT, Clinical Psychology etc.

Part 4 Training

4.1 Details of training opportunities on the unit

Induction on arrival, supportive Consultants who will supervise trainees (e.g. procedures such as subclavian CVC insertion) and readily attend, two ICU Consultant ward rounds per day, daily Microbiology ward round, internal ICU teaching, simulation, transfer training, Clinical Governance and M&M meetings (see below). 24/7 Critical Care Outreach Team service, monthly ICU Follow Up Clinic. The Salisbury ICU team received widespread international recognition during the Novichok nerve agent major incidents and has been rated 'Outstanding' by CQC and receives excellent feedback from trainees.

Salisbury District Hospital is a regional Cleft Lip & Palate Surgery, Plastic Surgery & Burns Unit and supra-regional Spinal Injuries centre with training opportunities associated with these specialties.

4.2 Details of departmental teaching

Internal ICU teaching, simulation and transfer training program, monthly ICU Clinical Governance meeting with regular educational topics, trainees welcome to attend weekly half day Anaesthetic tutorials, regional Wessex ACCS/ICM training days and PINCER (Portsmouth INTensive Care Exam Revision) course, BASIC, Beyond BASIC Mechanical Ventilation (all with Salisbury Consultant faculty), Wessex FICE courses (Salisbury has 2x FICE mentors with more coming soon).

4.3 Details of clinical governance meetings days and / or M & M

Monthly multi-disciplinary combined Clinical Governance and Morbidity & Mortality meetings.

4.4 Number of trainees on each tier of the rota

2nd on tier – ST3-7 Anaesthetic Trainees/Specialty Doctors: 1 in 7 rota with evening (3 hours) / weekday nights and weekend day / nights (12.5 hour shifts).

1st on tier – CT1-2 Anaesthetic Trainees/Trust Grade Doctors: 1 in 7 rota with evening (3 hours) / weekday nights and weekend day / nights (12.5 hour shifts).
