3.7 How is the unit staffed

There are usually between 12 to 16 junior doctors attached to the Critical Care unit who provide cover on a full shift rota. The doctors are a mixture of core trainee doctors (anaesthesia and medicine), FY1, anaesthetic specialty registrars, clinical fellows (anaesthetic and medical background, post foundation training), ICM trainees and MTIs (medical training initiative doctors). In addition to this – we have a dedicated Critical Care ODP to support our doctors and nurses – for procedures, intra and interhospital transfers and assistance during cardiac arrest calls.

Part 4 Training

4.1 Details of training opportunities on the unit

The unit recently moved into a brand-new facility (June 2022) – fully GPICS-2 compliant. There is a dedicated room for junior doctors to work in, with full IT facilities, ultrasound teaching area, and also a seminar/ teaching room.

We have accredited FUSIC mentors and supervisors, supporting POCUS accreditation.

There is a weekly ICU Teaching programme that is consultant lead and delivered. In addition to this – there are regular M&M meetings, journal club, ICU hot topics debate club and ICU MDT teaching programme.

There are plenty of opportunities to lead service improvement/ quality improvement projects and contribute towards a well -received Critical Care blog (criticalcarenorthampton.com). We have a state of the art simulation suite and we encourage trainees to be involved in simulation training.

4.2 Details of departmental teaching days

Weekly consultant supervised classroom sessions on ITU topics plus attendance at parent speciality teaching. Advanced trainee teaching delivered at a regional level 6 times per year. 4.3 Details of clinical governance meetings and / or M & M

Monthly multi-disciplinary governance meetings which feed into directorate governance meetings. ITU M&M held once a month. A quarterly departmental joint M&M meeting with Anaesthetic colleagues.

4.4 Number of trainees on each tier of the rota

16 Trainees allocated on the ICU Rota. In addition, there are three other rotas:

- Theatre rota (7 trainees)
- Obstetric rota (8 trainees)
- Senior trainee/ 3rd on call (6 trainees)

On any ICU shift – there will be 2 trainees, with at least one who is airway trained. There will also be a 3rd on call/ senior anaesthetic trainee available for support (out of hours)
