St Bartholomew's critical care units offer a unique opportunity for doctors to receive exceptional training in critical care medicine. Our Medical Critical Care Unit on the 6th floor has 16 beds, including seven specialist respiratory isolation rooms. Our unit is committed to caring for adult patients with complex surgical and non-surgical cardiac diseases, severe respiratory failure, and cancer therapy complications, including haematological malignancies. We provide advanced treatments such as membrane oxygenation (ECMO), Ventricular Support Devices (VAD), and Impella to support our patients' cardiac and respiratory needs. Patients from Barts Health and beyond rely on us for these life-saving services.

The weekly teaching programs are designed to inspire and prepare you for excellence in critical care. With consultant radiologists, cardiologists, and microbiologists joining us regularly to impart their knowledge, you will have the opportunity to learn from the very best. Our ICU's focus on high-disease severity patients also means you will work closely with our team of experts, including physiotherapists, occupational therapists, psychologists, speech and language therapists, and dietitians, to rehabilitate patients and help them recover. You can present at morbidity and mortality meetings, participate in journal clubs, and contribute to quality improvement projects.

Our unit is dedicated to providing doctors with the opportunity to enhance their skills and knowledge through specialized out-of-programme fellowships and special skills years (SSY). Our yearlong echocardiography fellowship has a track record of 100%

success in helping intensivists achieve high-level accreditation, such as the British Society of Echocardiography level 2 in transthoracic echocardiography or the European Diploma in Advanced Intensive Care Echocardiography (EDEC).

Furthermore, we offer focused intensive care echocardiography (FICE/FUSIC Heart) training and mentorship to inspire and guide those starting echocardiography. Our fellowship in medical education provides comprehensive training in all aspects of undergraduate and postgraduate education, and previous fellows have achieved a Post Graduate Certificate in medical education (PG Cert Med Ed).

Lastly, we take pride in offering a fellowship in follow-up after critical illness, where the fellow joins a mature multi-disciplinary critical care follow-up team. Our unit is committed to providing doctors with a supportive environment to help them achieve their goals and aspirations.
